




PROJECT SUMMARY

After years of educating children in makeshift facilities, Zagimē Anishinabēk has the opportunity to move through the early stages of design for a new school in the community. Kindrachuk Agrey Architecture has been hired as the architect to work with the Project Management Team and Zagimē Anishinabēk members to determine the requirements for, and to design, a new Kindergarten to Grade 8 school. The project will look at the possibilities for creating a educational environment that supports Zagimē's longterm vision and builds on the momentum in the community. Community engagement will play a major role in the project, with opportunities for participation in all project phases.

WHERE ARE WE NOW

Pre-design - This phase includes assessing the existing buildings and potential sites for the new school, as well as hearing from Zagimē students, staff and community members about what they want their new school to be. This phase also includes enrolment projections and analysis to determine the size/requirements of the school. A selected site and building program will be brought forward from this stage into design.

Description:






Q1 Are you a member of Zagimē Anishinabēk?





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




